## Example Idea: "Our Vision Tree"

- The Strong Tree Trunk: Imagine a big tree in the middle of your paper. The trunk is the strongest part of the tree. You can write "Our School's Heart" on the trunk. This shows how our school's special beliefs keep us strong and steady. Three Special Branches:
- Thinking Branch (Mind): On this branch, draw things like books, a bright light bulb, and children looking at a butterfly or star with big curious eyes.
- Feeling & Playing Branch (Body): Here, draw children playing happily, a heart, and maybe hands that look like they're giving a big, warm hug.
- Believing Branch (Spirit): For this one, you could draw a peaceful dove, a little church, children holding hands in a circle, and even a cloud with a rainbow peeking out!
- The Leaves: On all the branches, add leaves with words like "Kindness," "Sharing," "Friendship," and "Trust." These are like the little things we learn and feel at school every day.
- Roots Under the Ground: Trees have roots that go deep into the ground. Draw some roots and include "John 10:10" or other special words that remind us of our school's beliefs.
- Around Our Tree: Draw a globe and people of all ages and places, showing that our school is part of a big, friendly world.
- Shining Sun: At the top, draw a sun shining brightly. On its rays, write words like "Wisdom," "Help," "Hope," and "Love."

Remember, this is just one idea, and you can add or change anything you like. It's all about what our school means to you!
