Halloween Spiders Web-

This activity can work well during circle time for younger children or as a table activity for older children in school.

You will need a big ball of wool or string for this activity (if doing it as a table activity, split it into smaller balls so each table has a ball).

Ask the children to sit in a circle or form a circle around their table. Hold on to the end of the string and throw the wool to one of the children to catch and introduce today's question. Encourage the children to be mindfully holding onto a piece of the string as it is being passed around the circle from one child to another (it is going to create a spiders web).

Each day will have a different focus. For example; Monday- Tell us something that has made you smile today. Tuesday- Tell us something that makes you a special person. Wednesday- Pay a compliment to one of your classmates. Thursday- Tell us something that you are grateful for. Friday- Tell us something that you are looking forward to in half term.

Discussion points-

At the end of the game you could comment that everyone played a part in creating this unique spiders web and if one person was gone it would look different.

How did the question make them feel?

Did they feel that they played an important part in creating the web?

Did they learn anything new about themselves or other children?
