

Sunflower and Pumpkin Planting with Brackenhill Allotments Association


This year we are combining our two planting events and holding a drop in on Saturday 20th April between 10am and 2pm at Brackenhill Allotments.

Since the pandemic, ensuring strong attendance has been a top priority for us. We've been working hard to elevate the importance of attendance in line with Wakefield and National strategies, implementing various initiatives to address this issue.

One exciting initiative starting this half term is the "Potato Head Challenge." You may have noticed signs on classroom doors. This challenge encourages classes to earn a body part or accessory of a Potato Head for each week their attendance exceeds our target of 97%. At the end of the term, the class with the highest accumulation will be rewarded with a special treat. It's a fun way to motivate our children and promote regular attendance.
