Consultation - School Hours

We recently conducted a consultation regarding proposed changes to the school hours for the academic year 2024/25. This initiative was prompted by updated government guidance requiring schools to offer a minimum of 32.5 hours per week by September 2024.

Throughout the consultation period, we sought input from the school community on the proposed adjustments and feedback was considered and informed our decision-making process.

After careful consideration and discussion with the governing body, we have decided to extend the school day by an additional five minutes, with the end time changing to 3:20pm. This change will come into effect from the start of the new academic year in September 2024.

We want to thank all members of our school community for their participation in the consultation process.

Please note that there will be no changes to Nursery hours as a result of this decision.
