### **Practical Creativity**

It was an extremely busy week in Year 6. As part of our design technology curriculum, the pupils cooked a three course meal consisting of: stuffed peppers, salmon teriyaki with pak choi and brown rice, and pineapple upside down cake. They developed their cutting, cooking and cleaning skills in this project.

In Science they have been investing the components of the blood. They recreated blood using everyday food. They created plasma using water and yellow food colouring, nutrients from salt, red blood cells Cheerios and red food colouring, using marshmallows for white blood cells and platelets from pasta and purple paint.
