Dear Parents/Carers,

We are looking forward to welcoming children to the pantomime this evening. This year's pantomime is Sleeping Beauty. The performance will take place in school at 5.30pm and will finish at around 6:45pm. Children will need to arrive at school through the main entrance at 5.15pm for a prompt start at 5:30pm and be collected at 6:45pm. All children must be collected by a parent/carer after the performance. A small treat to enjoy during the performance can be brought in from home.

A place for your child/children can still be booked using the School Money system at a cost of £8.50. This event is open to children from Reception to Year 6.

Christmas Events

We are still hoping that our Christmas events in school can go ahead as planned. Please do not attend events if you feel unwell or have any Covid-like symptoms. We are also requesting that parents/carers take a lateral flow test before entering school. Face coverings should be worn and hands should be sanitised on entry.

Each show has a capacity of 60. Numbers are restricted to 2 family members per household (+ any pre-school siblings) sitting together and windows will be open so you may wish to wear an extra layer.

The measures in place for the events aim to reduce the risk of transmission and outbreaks so thank you for adhering to these.

Finally, you may have noticed that the chicken run has been covered with netting. Avian Influenza carried by wild birds means that all bird keepers must conform to government guidance meaning our chickens need to go into lockdown now too!



Early Writing Review (Early Years) - 29th November 2021

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Janet Mitchel our Early Years advisor visited school to work with us on identifying strengths and next steps in Early Writing. This is a key priority in our school development plan and an area we identified as the most adversely affected as a result of the pandemic.

Strengths:

- The schools selected phonics scheme is working and being delivered well. The programme is adhesive in that all sections link including the rhyme for letter formation. Children demonstrated good recall of sounds, sound pronunciation and blending skills.
- A range of writing opportunities are included in provision areas to support writing for a purpose and a focussed writing session happens during the week. Children are confident at 'having a go' at writing.
- Children are encouraged to speak in full sentences when planning activity choices.
- The outdoor area has been well developed, children have access to a range of tools and equipment to facilitate mark-making outside.
- In Nursery activities are in place, including dough disco, the fine motor table and access to play dough to support the development of finer motor skills. Good opportunities were used to mark-make in the snow on the day of the visit.

The review indicated that we are in a strong position and the agreed next steps in development were:

- Continue to add further resources to Nursery provision to practise hand eye coordination and hand strength and enhance different areas of provision further.
- Ensure all practitioners are proactive in encouraging children's mark-making and modelling writing within provision.
