The composer of the month for November in school is Beethoven, a German composer from the classical period into the romantic era.


Here are some of the clips we are using during collective times, some of his most popular pieces:

Another very popular Beethoven classic is Beethoven's 5th symphony - often used in films: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4IRMYuE1hI>


