Parent Questionnaire

Thank you for taking the time to complete the recent questionnaire. Although the vast majority of responses were extremely positive, I wanted to take the time to respond to some of the specific points raised by a few parents and provide further clarification. Responses from the questionnaire will also be shared with the governing body for their consideration:

- If you have any issues in relation to access to any areas of the school, please contact us so that we can look to resolve these.
- Coat hooks rather than lockers are unfortunately not possible. The reason lockers were installed to replace coat hooks was due to fire safety inspections stating that coats and bags were being stored in areas that served a means of escape. As a result of this, this is not something we are able to change and why we need to encourage that all property is housed within lockers.
- Repairing the wall at the front of school is of course a priority for us. Quotes for work are with the insurance company and work will start as soon as possible.
- Parking I continue to work closely with the Wakefield Council Road Safety Team and implement their recommendations in respect of improving parking outside the school. In addition, the school continues to fund the crossing patrol from its own budget even though this service was cut a number of years ago. I thank the majority of parents who continue to show consideration and respect for the safety of others by parking appropriately.
- Communication I would like to remind a small number of parents of the annual calendar which goes out in September stating parents evening dates and other key dates. This is available on the school website alongside all other dates and information about the school. We communicate in a variety of ways such as the weekly newsletter, school website, Facebook page, text message service, phone calls where appropriate, letters etc. We are a very busy school, and we do a great many additional activities with, and for, the children, many in our own time. Occasionally these maybe at short notice, and I apologise if this has been a problem. Please do let us know if there is anything else we can do to improve this area.
