Children also received their rewards for taking part in last summer's Olympic challenge and were introduced to this summer's Commonwealth Games challenge.



Safeguarding – Digital Wellbeing

A Current Concern...

It has been brought to our attention that a character named 'Huggy Wuggy' is being viewed by children online, some as young as nursery. The character can easily be viewed on YouTube, Roblox and TikTok and is a teddy bear with razor sharp teeth that sings songs about hugging whilst including inappropriate content.

Because of its name it is able to infiltrate firewalls and filters and is even accessible on YouTube for Kids.

What are the risks?

There are multiple risks that can arise from children and young people being exposed to frightening content before they are prepared.

- Added anxiety and stress.
- Intrusive thoughts could cause children to lose focus or sleep and could interrupt family rest cycles.
- New fears – Reduced sense of security.

What can we do?

- Please be vigilant of what your children are viewing/accessing online.
