## Sports Funding Grant Review 2017 – 2018

30 Competitions against other schools in 14 different sports.

6 Intra-House Competitions in a range different sports.

8 different after-school sports clubs with 153 children accessing them weekly.

92.5% of pupils enjoy their PE lessons, 89% of pupils enjoy playtimes and lunchtimes.

Our children attend 32 different local community sports clubs on a weekly basis, with an average of 2 hours spent at these.

32 hours of swimming lessons with 96.67% of children meeting national curriculum expectations.

Improved provision for PE lessons, playtimes, lunchtimes and after-school.

We worked with 5 different sports coach specialists over the year. With a 87% approval by the children.

Improvements to school sports day.

Representation at the Wakefield School Games and West Yorkshire School Games.

Completion of a complete audit of school PE and Physical Activity.

## Sport Funding Plan 2017-2018

**The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.**

Provided Competitive Challenges for children.	£1000	All pupils receive a range of physical activity during the school day so they meet the recommended guidelines.  Engage children in individual competitive physical challenges.	The purchase of new netball and basketball nets has increased the quality of provision for children in PE lessons, after-school clubs and during playtimes and lunchtimes. The basketball nets are frequently used at playtimes on the playground by both Key Stage 1 and 2 pupils.  A refurbishment of the PE shed has allowed for better access to resources and has improved the quality of provision available to teachers and pupils throughout the schools day.  New PE equipment has allowed us to increase the number of personal challenges pupils compete in. During the 2017-2018 academic year we provided pupils with 6 personal challenge competitions, from skipping to football. These were part of our School Games Gold Award application.

This has improved outcomes for our children and promoted a healthy lifestyle. Children have improved dramatically since their inclusion. The pogo sticks and stilts have provided personal challenge opportunities.</p>

They were also provided with 39 hours off extra-curricular activity.</p> <p>The forest schools lessons have provided children with a range of outdoor activities and experience that many have not experience before. It has provided physical and mental health benefits for many children.</p> <p>In pupil voice 89.25% of pupils said they enjoyed forest schools.</p>
